



# Regions of knowledge 2011 Call for proposals

One call, REGIONS-2011, targeting the transnational cooperation of regional research driven clusters

- for a total of 18,66 M €

#### **Participants**

- Consortia of **at least 3 regional research-driven clusters** from 3 different Member States or Associated countries
  - Possible representation by one member under conditions
  - Compulsory description of the full clusters and their triple helix structure
- **Coordinator**: either a regional authority or a fully fledged RDC (with legal entity)





# Regions of knowledge WP 2011 thematic priorities

- Boosting the competitiveness of transport related economy
- Support innovative capacity of European transport related industries and business
- Promote sustainable transport in an integrated technologyled and user friendly way
- Examples: **greening of transport**, development of **intermodal regional transport**, **urban mobility**, safety or security

We favour **innovative** and **cross-disciplinary approaches!** 



# Regions of knowledge WP 2011 – policy background

COM(2009) 279 on *A sustainable future for transport: Towards an integrated, technology-led and user friendly system* 

#### **Key policy objectives**

- Quality transport that is safe and secure
- A well maintained and fully integrated network
- More environmentally sustainable transport
- Protecting and developing the human capital
- Smart prices as traffic signals
- Planning with an eye to transport: improving accessibility





#### **REGIONS-2011** funded activities

#### **Transnational cooperation of RDCs**

- Analysis, development and implementation of research agendas
- Mentoring of regions with a less developed research profile for capacity building (compulsory)
- ➤ Initiatives to improve **integration**: definition of **joint action plans (JAP)**, together with **business plans** following SWOT analysis and definition of RTD needs
- > Measures towards the implementation of the JAP
- > International cooperation activities (optional)
- > **Dissemination** activities

**Beware:** Neither the implementation of the JAP nor any research can be funded under Regions



## **REGIONS 2011: Expected key outputs**

- Directory of RTD offer and demand
- Analysis (incl. SWOT) from an economic and R&D perspective
- Analysis of complementarities with potential other partners (mentoring and international cooperation)
- Regional strategy for RTD and innovation driven economic development
- ➤ Joint Action Plan (JAP) with its (mandatory) business plan about financing the implementation of the JAP



#### **REGIONS 2011: Expected impact**

- Developing and integrating research-driven clusters across Europe in order to promote regional economic development and worldwide competitiveness
- Contribute to smart specialisation of regions from R&D point of view
- > Stimulate more effective investments in R&D at regional level via tailor made regional strategies based on business needs
- ➤ Initiate private and public partnerships, which would mobilize European, national and regional funds and promote synergies notably with the Structural Funds, and the CIP
- ➤ **Including more regions** into the knowledge economy and the **ERA**, especially through the **mentoring** of regions with a less developed research profile



# **Funding scheme overview**

**Funding scheme:** CSA –CA (coordinating action)

**Duration:** up to 36 months

the JAP being finalized during the first half of the project

**Community contribution:** up to 3 M €

**Financing rate:** up to 100 % of eligible direct costs, max. 7% of indirect cost





### **Selection and negotiation**

#### Timetable of procedure

- ✓ Calls for proposals published : 20/07/2010
- ✓ Pre proposal check service until 09/11/2010 RTD-PRECHECK-REGIONS-2011@ec.europa.eu
- ➤ Deadline for submission: 09/12/2010
- ➤ Selection, with help of independent experts within 3 months of call closure
- ➤ Negotiation phase (March-July 2011)
- Commission decision in July
- ➤ Signature of grant agreements from August





## **Selection and negotiation**

Reminder: eligibility criteria, in particular for:

Cluster composition

Selection and award criteria:

- Scientific and technological excellence
   (including conformity with objectives of work programme)
- Quality and efficiency of the implementation and management (including financial aspects)
- Potential impact through the development, dissemination and use of project results
