# Macroeconomic figures:

- Regional GDP (PPS) 29.190 mln euro

- **48% for EU27 = 100** 6th position in Poland

## The Development Strategy for the Lodz Region for the years 2007-2020

Strategic objective: To increase the economic availability of the region

### Basic measures:

- To develop and modernise the transport, communication and technical infrastructure
- To develop road, railway, airway, urban and public transport
- To promote the development of the transcontinental airport for Poland between Lodz and Warsaw
- To increase the use of information technologies in transport and communication
- To promote the development of environmentally friendly means of transport





# Regional Operational Programme for the Lodzkie Voivodship for the years 2007-2013

### Priority axis I: *Transport infrastructure* Operational objectives:

- improvement of the state of and connection of the transport network of the Lodz Region to the network of national roads, the Trans-European network of transport TEN-T and the airports,
- - improvement of road traffic safety in the Lodz Region,
- increase in the competitiveness and improvement in the quality of public transport in towns and cities
- increase of the use of railway transport in passenger and goods services
- - increase of the significance of air transport







## Transport infrastructure of transnational dimension

Motorways: A-1 (Gdansk – Ostrava) – TEN-T priority axis A-2 (Berlin – Minsk) – TEN-T comprehensive network

Expressways: S-8 (Wroclaw – Warsaw) – TEN-T comprehensive network S-12 (direction Kiev) and S-74 (direction Lviv)

Main railways: Baltic-Adriatic Axis – TEN-T priority project 23 CE65/E65 (CMR), CE20/E20 – TEN-T comprehensive network

Regional airport Lublinek (new TEN-T proposal)








# Key projects to be realised

- Completion of the A-1, A-2 motorways; S-8, S-14, S-74 expressways
- High speed train "Y" railway Warsaw Lodz Poznan/Wroclaw
- Adjustment of the Central Main Railway (part of BBA) to the parameters of the high-speed railway (250-300 km/h)
- Lodz Aglomeration Railway co-finansing from ERDF
- Transcontinental central airport for Poland located between Lodz and Warsaw
- Development of the regional airports in Lodz (passangers airport) and Lask (cargo airport)


# Lodz Region as a main logistic hub in Poland:


- Transregional logistic center in Strykow (crossing of A-1 and A-2 motorways)

- Local logistic centers in Radomsko, Łowicz, Tomaszów Maz., Skierniewice, Sieradz
- Fuel terminal in Koluszki
- Logistic center with the mix-cargo function for air,road and railway transport




